

CC licenses for students

When publishing your thesis in Doria, you should take a moment to think about the copyright. You own the copyright to your own work (except for parts created by others that you may have reused) and you should tell your readers what they are allowed to do with your text.

This you can do by choosing a copyright-license from the section *Copyright information* when submitting your thesis in Doria.

You can

1) permit reuse of your thesis (given that you are referred to as the author) with the help of a Creative Commons (CC)-license. We recommend that you choose this option, when possible. These reliable licenses are created by lawyers and comply with the standard EU copyright legislation. A CC-license protects your copyright and allows you to decide which kinds of reuse of your work you permit.

2) choose not to permit any reuse of your thesis or parts of it by choosing the license-option *All rights reserved*. This means that others will have the right to quote from it, print it or download it, but if someone wants to reuse parts of your work or publish it on another webpage, s/he must contact you and ask for permission to do so. The downside to choosing this option is that, after some years, it may be very difficult to get hold of you. This means that you run the risk of having your work reused without your permission, or that your work is not used at all.

NB! When you choose a CC license, you should also allow the electronic publishing of your thesis Doria at the same time. This has to do with the status of a CC-license as a license designed for open publishing. If you choose some other publishing alternative for your thesis, you should choose the *All rights reserved*.

Which CC-license should I choose?

Please note that your choice of CC-license is **final** – and consider carefully which alternative you choose!

When you choose a CC-license from the dropdown menu in Doria, the metadata of your thesis' will receive a CC-logo that is visible in Doria. Please, also add the license information to your Word file, for example by using the CC License chooser: <https://chooser-beta.creativecommons.org/> You can also copy the license logo from the CC webpage: <https://creativecommons.org/mission/downloads/>

Place the license information on the title page, preferably under the information about author, institution, supervisor etc.

If you want to add the license information to your final PDF-file, choose “File > Properties > Description > Additional metadata, and under *Copyright Notice* fill in which license you've chosen + the license text, like this:

CC licenses allowing both commercial and non-commercial use of your work:



Creative Commons Attribution (*cc by*) 4.0 international

Choosing this license, you allow others to distribute, remix, adapt and build upon your material in any medium and format, including for commercial use. You must be attributed as the creator and the reuser must refer to the CC-BY-license with a hyperlink and state if any modifications or changes have been made to your text.



Creative Commons Attribution-ShareAlike (*cc by-sa*) 4.0 international

Choosing this license, you allow others to distribute, remix, adapt and build upon your material in any medium and format, including for commercial use. You must be attributed as the creator and the reuser must refer to the CC-BY-SA-license with a hyperlink and state if any modifications or changes have been made to your text.

If others remix, adapt or build upon your material, however, they must license the modified material under identical terms.



Creative Commons Attribution-NoDerivatives (*cc by-nd*) 4.0 international

Choosing this license, you allow others to distribute and copy your material in any medium or format, including for commercial use. You must be attributed as the creator and the reuser must refer to the CC-BY-ND-license with a hyperlink.

You do, however, forbid any adaptation of your work. That is, your work can only be used and distributed if it remains in its original form.

CC licenses allowing only non-commercial use:



Creative Commons Attribution-NonCommercial (*cc by-nc*) 4.0 international

Choosing this license, you allow others to distribute, remix, adapt and build upon your material only in any non-commercial medium or format. You must be attributed as the creator and the reuser must refer to the CC-BY-NC-license with a hyperlink and state if any modifications or changes have been made to your text.



Creative Commons Attribution-NonCommercial-ShareAlike (*cc by-nc-sa*) 4.0 international

Choosing this license, you allow others to distribute, remix, adapt and build upon your material in any non-commercial medium or format. You must be attributed as the creator and the reuser must refer to the CC-BY-NC-SA-license with a hyperlink and state if any modifications or changes have been made to your text.

Also, any modified new versions of your text must be licensed under identical terms.



Creative Commons Attribution-NonCommercial-NoDerivatives (*cc by-nc-nd*) 4.0 international

Choosing this license, you allow others to distribute and copy your material in any noncommercial medium or format. You must be attributed as the creator and the reuser must refer to the CC-BY-NC-ND-license with a hyperlink.

You do, however, forbid any adaptation of your work. That is, your work can only be used and distributed if it remains in its original form.
